school council involvement

Saddle Ridge School Council and Saddle Ridge School Society continue to play a vital role in our school community. In their advisory role, the School Council provided the school with feedback and suggestions about the School Development Plan, school activities and events. The School Development Plan was discussed at the October School Council Meeting. The School Results and Fee Report will be shared at the November School Council meeting. The School Council established the Saddle Ridge School Society, which was incorporated in January 2012. The Saddle Ridge School Society worked on a number of fundraising activities to support the building of a school playground.

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Highlights

- 85.1% of students in grades 1 to 4 achieved an indicator of 2, 3, or 4 (grade level expectations) on K to 9 Report card stem: "Reads to explore, construct and extend understanding.
- The percentage of students with an indicator of 2, 3, 4 on the stem "Understands mathematical concepts and relationships" was 92.7 percentage points.

student results

Reporting on Achievement Target

Language Arts

- **85.1%** of students in grades 1 to 4 achieved an indicator of 2, 3, or 4 (grade level expectations) on K to 9 Report card stem: "Reads to explore, construct and extend understanding
 - Previous year's result: 80.0% (Grades 1 to 3)
 - Current year result: 85.1% (Grades 1 to 4 due to program expansion)
 - This target was met

Factors that contributed to changes in results:

- · Continued focus on teaching high impact literacy strategies
- Continued focus on embedding disciplinary literacy across the curriculum

Additional Reporting - Mathematics

- 92.7% of students in grades 1 to 4 achieved an indicator of 2, 3, or 4 (grade level expectations) on K to 9 Report card stem: "Understands mathematical concepts and relationships"
- 90.5% of students in grades 1 to 4 achieved an indicator of 2, 3, or 4 (grade level expectations) on K to 9 Report card stem: "Models, represents and communicates mathematical ideas."

Saddle Ridge School is located in the community of Sadldle Ridge and serves families residing in the community. The school supports approximately 600 learners in grades K to 4 who speak a variety of languages.

Saddle Ridge School students transitioning to Grade 5, who live in the community of Saddle Ridge, attend Peter Lougheed School for grades 5-9 and then Nelson Mandela High School for grades 10-12.

The school has 24 classrooms, one gymnasium, a music room and a Learning Commons. Every classroom has SMARTboard technology. To further technology use in classrooms while permitting flexibility of space, the school has three wireless laptop carts and one iPad cart.
